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MINUTES

The March Board Meeting of the Roanoke Valley Broadband Authority was held on Friday, March 16, 2018 at 8:30 a.m. at 601 S. Jefferson Street, 2nd Floor Conference Room, Roanoke, VA.

1. CALL TO ORDER, WELCOME AND ROLL CALLTO ORDER

In the absence of Chairman Boggess, Vice Chairman McEvoy called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. and welcomed those in attendance. Wayne Strickland, Secretary to the Broadband Authority, called the roll and reported that a guorum was present.

<u>Roanoke Valley Broadband Authority Board Members</u>: <u>Present:</u> Bob Cowell, City of Roanoke; Tom Gates, Roanoke County; and Mike McEvoy, Citizen. <u>Absent:</u> Kevin Boggess, City of Salem and Gary Larrowe, Botetourt County.

OTHERS/GUESTS IN ATTENDANCE

Broadband Authority Staff: Jordan Leet, Sales Director; and Frank Smith, President and CEO.

Roanoke Valley-Alleghany Regional Commission Staff: Wayne Strickland, Matt Miller and Jackie Pace.

2. <u>APPROVAL OF THE JANUARY 19, 2018 MINUTES</u>

The January 19, 2018 Minutes of the Roanoke Valley Broadband Authority Board Meeting were distributed earlier.

ROANOKE VALLEY BROADBAND AUTHORITY ACTION:

Mr. Gates moved that the Minutes of the January 19, 2018 meeting of the Roanoke Valley Broadband Authority be approved, as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Cowell and carried.

3. TREASURER'S REPORT

Acceptance of the Financial Reports

The Financial Reports, ending January 31, 2018 and February 28, 2018, were distributed earlier in the agenda packet.

Frank Smith reported on the "Installations" line item under Non-Operating Revenue (page 6 in agenda) at 195%. Mr. Smith noted that the large percentage was due to receiving non-operating revenue back in from installation services fees. He added the Authority is on track from both a projection and revenue standpoint.

ROANOKE VALLEY BROADBAND AUTHORITY ACTION:

Mr. Gates moved acceptance of the Financial Reports, ending January 31, 2018 and February 28, 2018, as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Cowell and carried.

4. APPROVAL OF THE FY 2019 BUDGET

Frank Smith reported that there is a moderate decrease to the 2019 Budget. The total amount of the Fiscal Year 2019 Budget is \$1,055,681. Smith noted the staff is doing things differently as far as allocating contributing capital from the participating localities. As the Authority goes forward, their goal is to be cashflow positive by July 1, 2022. The RVBA has been able to obtain better and more cost-effective solutions for fiber management and Network Operations Center (NOC) services through properly managed procurements. This concerted effort has led to securing new NOC services that provide deeper network coverage and at 28% less cost. The RVBA continues to manage costs and is making excellent progress in obtaining more value in each dollar spent in network operations and installations through the right partnerships. Driving costs down and extracting more value of each dollar spent is an important and consistent priority for the RVBA.

ROANOKE VALLEY BROADBAND AUTHORITY ACTION:

Mr. Gates moved that the FY2019 Budget be approved, as presented. The motion was seconded by Vice Chairman McEvoy and carried.

5. PROJECT UPDATES

- Jordan Leet was introduced as the recently hired Sales Director for the Roanoke Valley Broadband Authority.
- Continue to look at forecasting in FY2019 and the out years.
- Looking at continued partnerships with last-mile providers both the traditional providers and the Wireless Internet Service Providers (WISPs).
- Reported that the staff is looking at bills and other broadband issues before the General Assembly – power companies being involved in getting fiber to homes in neighborhoods; creation of a chief broadband advisor under the Virginia Secretary of Administration; becoming more actively involved with the Broadband Advisory Council in 2019; and looking at what is happening with wireless deployments and small cell site wireless technologies and deployment models.

6. REQUEST FOR A CLOSED MEETING PURSUANT TO VA. CODE 2.2-3711.33

Motion was made by Mr. Gates and seconded by Mr. Cowell to convene a closed meeting for the purpose of discussing business prospects and negotiating strategies pursuant to §2.2-3711.A.33. of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, providing that closed meetings are permitted to discuss confidential proprietary information and trade secrets developed by or for a local authority created in accordance with the Virginia Wireless Service Authorities Act to provide qualifying communications services as authorized by Article 5.1 of Chapter 15 of Title 56, where disclosure of such information would be harmful to the competitive position of the authority, as provided in subdivision 19 of §2.2-3705.6 of the Code.

The motion was adopted and carried by a vote of 3 to 0. The Roanoke Valley Broadband Authority went into a closed meeting at 8:46 a.m.

7. END CLOSED MEETING AND RECONVENE REGULAR MEETING

Motion was made by Mr. Gates and seconded by Mr. Cowell that the Broadband Authority end the closed meeting and return to its regular meeting. The motion was adopted and carried by a vote of 3 to 0. The Roanoke Valley Broadband Authority ended the closed meeting and returned to its regular meeting at 9:22 a.m.

8. RESOLUTION OF CERTIFICATION OF CLOSED MEETING

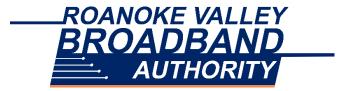

Election of officers will take place at the June 15, 2018 meeting of the Roanoke Valley Broadband Authority.

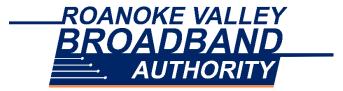

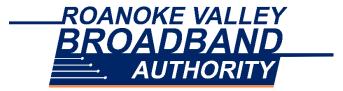
