# November 15, 2024 Draft Minutes

The November 15, 2024, Board Meeting of the Roanoke Valley Broadband Authority was held at 8:30 a.m. in the WVWA Boardroom on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor @ 601 S. Jefferson Street, Roanoke, VA. 24011

#### 1. CALL TO ORDER, WELCOME AND ROLL CALL

Chairman Caywood called the meeting to order at 8:32 a.m. and welcomed those in attendance.

Roll was called by Mr. Barry Stacy from the RVBA team, as the Secretary Ms. Tywanii Ross was absent. All Board members present at the time of roll call except for Mr. Michael McEvoy who was also absent, with a quorum being formed.

#### 2. Approval of Minutes

The September 2024 minutes were presented. No additions or corrections were needed. Chairman Caywood requested a motion to approve. Motion was made by Mr. Rob Light, City of Salem, and seconded by Mr. Keith Perry, Carilion. All present agreed with a voice vote, 5-0.

#### 3. Treasurer's Report

Mr. James Bandy presented the Operating Statements for the months of September and October 2024. The MRC (monthly recurring) revenue has increased we have a lot of builds in the forecast and looking well. NRC (non-recurring charges) are from the City of Roanoke builds on all their Recreation centers; this is a one-time fee. Mr. Bandy explained the cash flow numbers with cash on hand holding steady. NRC for the City of Roanoke will not be added until the projects have been completed. Mr. Caywood acknowledged that the subject of locality support will have to be revisited soon, meaning the local Government will put funds into the Capital side. Mr. Bandy explained we are operating and still finding new customers and contracts are being renewed. There was a question for the September 2024 salaries, from Mr. Rob Light, City of Salem. Mr. Bandy stated that he would investigate and address it at the next Board meeting.

#### 4. Project Updates

As stated, the City of Roanoke has signed to have their Recreation Centers added to their contract, as well as their Fire Stations, which they have received quotes for. The Western Virginia Water Authority has signed already to add a ring closure at the Hollins Operation Center, and it is in the works which adds NRC and new MRC to the revenue line when it is complete. The Goodwill project at Melrose Plaza is complete, and the goal was just to be a part of the Community Project.

The purchase of the City of Roanoke's dark fiber will continue to grow. Mr. Bandy is working with an Engineering company to look at the update of the core infrastructure of the RVBA, which he has stated in previous meetings that it needs to be updated,

with what the cost of the updates in mind and then coming back to the Board to state what that cost would be with the target year being 25/26. Road work being done and VDOT has inquired about shifting the work (infrastructure) just a speed bump that comes along with the territory, which is also a cost to the RVBA. Mr. Rob Light, City of Salem, and Mr. Gary Larrowe, County of Botetourt spoke of the RVBA working closely with Economic Development in each locality for new builds. Mr. Bandy has already spoken to Economic Development with the City of Roanoke. Chair Caywood mentioned the Debt roll off soon could be potential for Capital funding for the RVBA, which is built into the County of Roanoke's budget today and can be revisited. December 2025 would be the goal to update the core infrastructure which in turn would be March 2026 once everyone that is needed can be scheduled. Chair Caywood stated that it did need to be discussed as far as cost very soon. Mr. Watts Burks, Attorney for the RVBA updated Board members on a legal matter concerning the RVBA with a call being scheduled to discuss the matter and will update the Board as it comes.

#### 5. Other Business

Next meeting will be held on January 17, 2025, @ 8:30 a.m. Chair Caywood requested a motion to adjourn, motion made by Mr. Keith Perry, Carilion and seconded by Mr. Rob Light, City of Salem.
